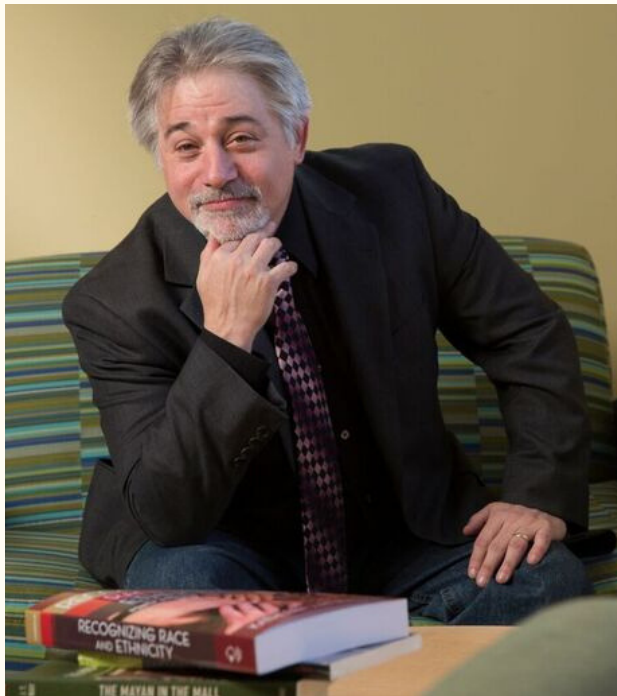

## ***Kill It to Save It: An Autopsy of Capitalism's Triumph Over Democracy***

For decades now, American voters have been convinced to support public policies that only benefit those in power. It seems as if many Americans have given up on quality in public education, safe streets, living wages and even democracy itself. Corey Dolgon argues that American citizens accept reform policies that destroy the public sector and a political culture that embraces an environment where arguments "feel right" without any regard for facts or empirical data. Dolgon examines this political discourse with narratives on the post-Vietnam War era, political reality TV, and debates over Black Lives Matter. Dr. Dolgon is the author of three books, including the award-winning *The End of the Hampton: Scenes from the Class Struggle in America's Paradise*.
